


Importance of Play



Programs for Parents, Caregivers, and Children Ages Birth to Five

Check the website or your local branch for a schedule of dates and times. Space may be limited and passes may be required. Check with your local branch for more information.

Baby (0-18 months)

Enjoy songs, nursery rhymes, and fingerplays with their favorite adult. This program includes book-sharing time and language-enrichment activities.

Toddler (18-36 months)

Children and parents will participate in this interactive storytime as we share songs, rhymes, and stories.

Preschool (3-5 years old)

Includes stories, songs, and much more to build literacy skills and help children develop a love of books.

Five and Under (0-5 years old)

Children and their parents will enjoy books, songs, rhymes, and movement activities while building language and literacy skills.

Family (all ages)

A variety of books, songs, and participatory activities will be shared for children of all ages and their parents.

Sensory Storytime

Interactive, educational program designed for children at preschool level with autism or other sensory integration challenges.

Parent-Child Workshops (1-3 years old)

Over the course of five weeks, spend time together, play, make friends, and talk one-on-one with specialists in child development. Registration may be required.

Our Family Place Libraries

The Clark County, Las Vegas, Whitney and Windmill Libraries have all been designated a part of the network of Family Place Libraries featuring safe, fun environments where you and your young children can read, play and learn. These specially-designed spaces feature materials for children and parents including board books, picture books, toys, puzzles, blocks and drawing stations, all creating opportunities for little ones to explore. As your child's first and most important teacher, these activities will help you build your child's early literacy skills.

Fostering a Love of Books and Reading

1,000 Books before Kindergarten

A program designed to encourage parents of preschoolers to read 1,000 books with their child before they start school. Pick up a folder from any of our branches to participate in this self-directed, no-time-limit reading incentive program to set the stage for success in reading and in school.

Club Read

Our annual summer reading club fosters the love of reading, and participating families receive special incentives. In addition, there are plenty of opportunities to attend fun, family-friendly programs for free!

Our branches incorporate early literacy skills into all of our programs for preschoolers, while modeling for their caregivers the early literacy practices of singing, talking, reading, playing and writing.
